In the border village of R.S. Pura, where uncertainty is a daily reality, 95 school kits were distributed to children from economically vulnerable families. This initiative, led by Sewa International in collaboration with Sewa Bharti Jammu & Kashmir, aimed to ensure that children like Viraj, a Class 8 student with big dreams but limited means, are not left behind.

Covering students from LKG to Class 10, the drive served as more than just a material donation—it was a step towards restoring dignity, hope, and access to education in some of the region's most underserved communities.

This initiative brought hope and dignity to families living on the margins, reaffirming our belief in "Nar Sewa, Narayan Sewa"—serving humanity is serving the divine.



Empowering Girls Through Menstrual Health Awareness in Kutch



In the heart of Kutch, Gujarat, over 550 adolescent girls and teachers from two schools Shree Mankuva Kedavani Mandal Sanchalit High School and Maa Ashapura English & Gujarati Medium School, came together for a conversation long kept in the shadows: menstrual health and hygiene.

Through engaging sessions, Sewa International not only broke the silence but also introduced reusable sanitary pads- a sustainable, eco-conscious alternative promoting dignity, health, and environmental care. These efforts are a step towards creating confident, informed young women who can manage their health with pride and without shame.

Celebrating Harela with Green Deeds and Growing Hopes



In celebration of Harela Utsav, Sewa International, in collaboration with the Forest Department, conducted a plantation drive across two villages in Pokhri block, Uttarakhand. A total of 550 saplings were planted, breathing new life into the hills.
